What do students say they want in English testing?

- A shorter/easier test
- Faster score reporting
- More **flexibility** in the access to and timing of testing
- Fair and consistent marketing of test items
- Access to lots of free prep



What do teachers seek from standardized English tests?

- A score that genuinely reflects the student's level of proficiency
- Transparent scoring of test items
- Secure testing that can be trusted
- Verifiable research that informs test development and equates the test scores to other known levels
- Positive consequences for the student



MyBest Scores



MyBest Scores (superscores or clubbing of scores)

Showing the test taker's best performance

- Combination of the **highest** section scores from all valid test dates
- Score reports show both MyBest™
 scores and the scores from a single
 test date
- Automatically included in all score reports starting August 1, 2019



How do MyBest Scores work?


In this example, the test taker needed to achieve a total score of 80, with no section score lower than 18, to meet the requirements of University X. This test taker meets the University X score requirement with valid scores, and without taking the test a third time



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Are MyBest Scores valid?

Yes: ETS research confirms it.

- An ETS study compared the MyBest scores and the most recent test date scores of all test takers who repeated the test within a recent 2-year period
- The research found that there is only a small average difference between the MyBest total score and the most recent total score (approximately 4 points on 1-120 scale)



Are *MyBest Scores valid?*Independent research studies confirm it

- Studies in the testing field show that using the best subtest scores are just as **valid** as other common scoring methods (e.g., most recent score, average score)
- Independent research on academic outcomes for two very large achievement tests using the highest section scores found that students achieved higher than predicted GPAs at the end of first year

The Shorter Test



The Shorter Test

Less testing time; same high-quality results

- Testing time **reduced** by 30 minutes,
 to three hours
- Same overall test format and question types
- Fewer questions in the Reading,
 Listening and Speaking sections
- No change to the score scale

Does the shorter test have the same level of quality?

- ETS researchers analyzed data from multiple 2018 TOEFL iBT® test administrations to compare the reliability of the longer and shorter versions
- The data showed that test reliability is maintained with the shortened test
- The shorter test maximizes
 measurement efficiency without
 sacrificing quality





Shorter Test – Specific Changes

	All Tests <u>Before</u> August 1, 2019	All Tests <u>After</u> August 1, 2019
Reading (fewer questions per passage)	3-4 reading passages 12-14 questions each 60-80 minutes	3-4 reading passages 10 questions each 54-72 minutes
Listening (fewer lectures)	4-6 lectures 6 questions each 2-3 conversations 5 questions each 60-90 minutes	3-4 lectures 6 questions each 2-3 conversations 5 questions each 41-57 minutes
Speaking (fewer tasks)	6 tasks 2 independent 4 integrated 20 minutes	4 tasks 1 independent 3 integrated 17 minutes
Writing (no change)	2 tasks 1 integrated 1 independent 50 minutes	2 tasks 1 integrated 1 independent 50 minutes



Faster Score Reporting



Scores in 6 Days and retesting after 3 days

Get scores sooner

- Starting with the October 26, 2019
 test, test takers can view their scores
 online 6 days after their test date,
 instead of 10 days
- Test takers can download PDF score reports in 7–8 days
- Repeat test registration can now been done after 3 days




